
SOCIETY FOR AMERICAN ARCHAEOLOGY

This organization is dedicated to providing scholarships and support to medical and health professions students.

Undergraduate and graduate scholarship opportunities are available to Native students from the Native Forward Scholars Fund.

AMAZON FUTURE ENGINEERING

The Amazon Future Engineer Scholarship is open now until the **deadline of December 14th**. If you are pursuing a degree in computer science or engineering, have a notable need for financial aid and have taken at least one computer science or engineering class in high school or college, you may be eligible to apply!

FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA

FFA offers a variety of scholarships for students pursuing agriculture-related fields. Awards vary in amount and are available to both FFA members and non-members based on academic achievement and leadership potential. Application **deadline is January 9, 2025.**

JACK KENT COOKE FOUNDATION TRANSFER

The Cooke Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship is a highly selective scholarship for the nation's top community college students seeking to complete their bachelor's degrees at four-year colleges or universities. Application <u>deadline is January 9, 2025</u>

JEANNETTE RANKIN NATIONAL SCHOLAR GRANT

This scholarship supports low-income women aged 35 and older who are pursuing technical, vocational, or undergraduate degrees. It aims to empower women through education and career advancement opportunities. **Deadline for all scholarships are February 16, 2025.**

UDALL FOUNDATION

The Udall scholarship application has opened! The Scholarship Program identifies future leaders in environmental, Tribal public policy, and health care fields. You need to contact your Udall state/faculty representative to get access to the application portal by March 4, 2025 and applications must be **submitted by March 5, 2024.**

AMERICAN LIBRARY ASSOCIATION

ALA provides over \$300,000 annually for students pursuing master's degrees in library and information studies. Scholarships range \$2,500 to \$8,000 with opportunities for students in specific areas like children's librarianship, public librarianship, and underrepresented groups.

NATIONAL SOCIETY FOR COLONIAL DAMES OF AMERICA

These scholarships support students pursuing careers in nursing or related health fields. Award amounts vary, and applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents enrolled in accredited pre-med or prenursing programs.
