AGENDA ITEM I: CALL TO ORDER

Chair Ralph Richards called the September 19, 2023 regular meeting of the UNM-Gallup Local Advisory Board to order at 4:01 PM with roll call. A quorum was present.

Motion was made by Board Member Vian to approve the UNM-Gallup Local Advisory Board Agenda as presented. Motion was seconded by Board Member Apel and approved by unanimous roll call vote at 4:02 PM.

AGENDA ITEM II: VOTE TO APPROVE MINUTES

Motion was made by Board Member Vian to approve the June 20, 2023 Board Regular meeting minutes as presented. Motion was seconded by Board Member Apel and approved by unanimous roll call vote at 4:03 PM.

AGENDA ITEM IV: COMMENTS FROM STUDENT, FACULTY & STAFF CONSTITUENCIES

Faculty Assembly: Keri Stevenson, Faculty Assembly President was not present so no report was given, but a report was included in the packet.

Staff Council: Frank Sanchez, Staff Council President presented a verbal report at the meeting. Staff and Leadership have made some significant progress towards information sharing with transparency. Recently there was a forum on the soon to be implemented TimeClocks Plus system with a Q&A session, which addressed concerns of the staff. We are working to bring Staff Development trainings to campus and just held (3) recently with the help of main campus. Dean Zimmerman requested a Wellness Day, which was held during Kick-Off week. UNMG Staff Council has a Wellness Committee the committee is committed to bring initiatives and wellness events to our staff and faculty in the coming months. This



will include some community-based activities as well. Our current imitative is a semester long BMI Challenge, to which we have approximately 15 participants. In other Staff Council business, we are currently waiting for an answer from our Leadership team on the request of a 0.25 FTE Admin Assistant position for our organization. Lastly, outside the scope of Staff Council, Mr. Sanchez is looking for businesses to take the opportunity to showcase students from the Skills USA team for presentations, which last from 5 to 7 minutes.

Public Relations: Richard Reyes, Public Relations Specialist presented a verbal report. A report was also included in the monthly packet. News media reports includes electronic links to the articles and some are just UNM mentions. Still placing advertising ads for the 2023-2024 year. Started off with the Fall Registration in multiple publications and a few radio ads. This year we also started advertising through Meta (Facebook, Messenger, Instagram). This seems to have a good reach and we will continue to explore the online advertising. Our Education commercial is finally airing at with Allen Theaters at Red Rock 10. It started running this summer in time for Fall Registration. The Education Dept. has seen an increase in enrollment this year, but hard to gage the impact of the commercial. Waiting on a proposal from iHeart Media for online advertising. Website Newsroom articles are listed on the website and are continually being updated. Our UNMG social media has had some changes, with Facebook and Instagram seeing increased followers, but LinkedIn and Twitter (X) losing some followers. We have created some rack cards for marketing cards that give an at a "Glance" look for a more focused look. PR will be working with individual departments to order rack cards to showcase their programs. We are currently starting the planning for the 2023 Holiday in New Mexico event. We will be making some changes this year and scaling back as it was over crowded last year. We will not have any outside entity booths, only UNM booths this year. We will focus on quality over quantity. We will not purchase/serve posole this year. We are still working on the entertainment aspect. Items that are pending/in progress: Still working on hiring a Sr. Web Designer. We had a second posting of the position and the best consideration date is this week with some good candidates. Richard is working with the Executive Team to put out a newsletter to address the campus community and provide updates. The hope is to expand this to the general community as well. We have an opportunity to advertise in the Visitors Guide that is put out by the Gallup-McKinley County Chamber of Commerce. We plan to work with the Chamber and the City of Gallup on potential content in the printed guide and the VisitGallup.com website.

AGENDA ITEM V: COMMENTS FROM LOCAL ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERS RELATED TO ITEMS ON AGENDA

Board Members questioned why UNM-Gallup would want to scale back on the Holiday in New Mexico event. What is it that UNM is trying to ascertain with this event, i.e. increase our enrollments, be part of the community, increase exposure? All Board Members in attendance opposed the scaling back and are in favor of making the event bigger and better than last year. Chairman Richards suggested we spread the event into different parts of the campus, not limit it to Gurley Hall.

Board Member Vian asked if there will be State Representatives at the meetings once they figure out who that is? Dr. Ezzell stated that this is definitely on our radar.

AGENDA ITEM VII: CHANCELLOR'S REPORT

Chancellors Report | Dr. Sabrina Ezzell

- A. HED Capital Outlay Summer Hearings: UNM-Gallup presented three (3) supplemental projects at the HED Capital Outlay Summer Hearings in July 2023.
 - GO Bond 2020 CTE Project \$3 Million; Started out as \$9 Million and UNMG matching was \$3,405,300 with 2023 supplemental of \$1.8 Million and 2024 supplement of \$2.4 Million of additional monies due to electrical costs; Grand total of \$10,605,300.
 - ii. GO Bond 2022 Student Experience \$3 Million; UNMG matching \$1 Million and 2024 supplemental of \$1.5 Million; Grant total of \$5.5 Million.
 - iii. GO Bond 2024 Fine Arts Renovation \$4 Million; Since UNMG is way above the 25% match requirement, we are requesting a matching waiver. Grand total \$4 Million. The Fine Arts Dept. has not been renovated since it was built. Gallup has the highest percentage of artisans in the state so our Arts department is very important in this aspect of contributing to the livelihood of our community.

HED is supporting all of these requests but we will have to wait until the Legislative session to determine if we will receive the funds for these requests.

B. Daycare Opening – There are 36 spaces available for children at the daycare and we are at 67% capacity. We have slots for infants up to 1 year of age, toddlers up to 2 years of age and up to 3 years of age. We have Kellogg funds that are covering costs of the Daycare Director and Assistant Director through February 2024. Currently we have 1 slot available for Infants, 5 slots for toddlers and 6 slots for 2-year-olds. Public Relations advertisements have included email blasts to students, faculty and staff, as well as flyers around campus, social media posts and media stories in order to get the word out. Of note is the child care assistance by the state in all of these PR notices. When the day care opened the priority was 50% UNMG Students and 50% GMCS Instructors. Once the registration deadline ended then UNMG opened the remainder of their slots up to faculty and staff, but they have wait lists started for both groups. There has been discussion of expanding the day care into the basement level of the building in order to accommodate more children. The Education/Academic side of the daycare center is looking into accreditation, but not from the School District side.

Dean of Instruction | Mr. John Zimmerman, Dean of Instruction

A. Academic Program Review – There are many systems, policies and processes that can be improved upon in order to become more efficient to serve our student better. The top of the list includes coordinating efforts of Academic Program reviews and institutional assessment efforts, due to the fact that these two courses have been independent in the past, which has created some issues in the past. This includes



building calendars to where the assessments feed into the academic program reviews and this helps us to get through the internal processes more effectively. This has only been done previously in our accredited areas, but others, it has not, so this should help.

- B. Partnerships with Community We currently have a partnership with GMCS on their career pathways. We are providing that last piece of the 3-yr process with the dual credit as well as other initiatives such as internships, capstone courses, etc. We are also working with College of Education and focusing on alternative licensure and teacher endorsements. Our Division Chairs are working with both of these groups in these efforts.
- C. Workforce Development This has been identified as a need here at UNM-Gallup and we are working on initiatives for our area in particular. Things are in the early stages but UNMG is highly committed to this for the needs of our community.
- *D.* Hiring Organizing the process, making them consistent and that we are meeting best practices. This is for the entire process; from how we create the paperwork, how we train people on search committees, how we professionalize the interview process for candidates who come to our campus to the end result.

Student Affairs | Jayme McMahon, Director of Student Affairs

- A. Census Census date was 9/9/23 and the Student head count was 1666 which is a jump from 1584 last fall. Credit Hours have also increased from 16,672 and they are over 18,000 this fall. We are seeing some growth and are proud to serve so many students in our region. By Student Campus we are at 2967, up from 2326 last Fall. Gallup is growing and serving the most students within our service area with more of our student returning in-person. We believe we are seeing the increase due to the addition of new programs being offered, as well as the changes being made in Student Affairs in the approach to recruitment and admission.
- B. Hiring Student Activities Director which will represent student and will help getting our student government back on track. Recreational Services, which will focus on the gym with programing and student activities.
- C. Comprehensive Student Assessment Student Services has been working with Faculty and other staff in this initiative. We want to implement our own assessment plan which is critical in meeting student needs, but also maintaining accreditation. Another goal is Comprehensive Student Assessment where we assess students' priorities, students' needs and the level of satisfaction of the services we are providing.
- D. Transition Program for adults with intellectual disabilities to allow them transition from high school into post-secondary school then prepare them for the workforce, and any other goals they may have. We would like to be certified so that this would allow the students to use financial aid in federal funding programs. NM only has (1) formal CPT program and it is at ENMU in Ruidoso. There is a huge need in this region and UNM-Gallup could meet that need.
- E. Mental Health making strides on our campus with this and other health needs. UNMG has been working with UNM in Albuquerque to implement a platform called Timely Care for students, which is a virtual platform which connects them with all



types of health providers. One of our goals is to identify a space for students to use so that they have the connectivity to make their sessions/appointments. Will work with Richard Reyes to inform students of this new benefit. Also, UNMG was notified yesterday by HED that we were selected for an award of \$250,000 to provide mental health and case management support to our students. Our proposal included having a licensed counselor on staff, but having case managers on staff for food insecurities, housing insecurities, or daycare options. Anything that students may need help with applications for assistance. Students will receive up to 5 sessions.

Business Operations | Mr. Robert Griego, Director of Business Operations
