We have certainly come a long way as a campus community since the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic on March 11, 2020—which was 523 days ago.

This extraordinary moment in our history—the return of face-to-face instruction after so many days, weeks, and months apart—is truly made possible by all your good work and the extraordinary efforts of our local public health workers. UNM-GALLUP COVID-SAFETY PROTOCOLS

I'd like to briefly remind you of some important guidelines and safety protocols that are in place to ensure a safe start to the fall semester and continued normal operations as the Delta variant surges in parts of our nation:

- With revised CDC data, wearing a face mask indoors is required throughout campus. A mask is not required outdoors and on the fitness trail unless you are unvaccinated.
- All faculty, staff, and students are required to be vaccinated and upload proof of their vaccination on or before September 30, 2021. A request for accommodation for those with certain medical conditions or sincere religious beliefs that would prohibit them from getting a vaccine can be submitted prior to this deadline.
- Please work closely with your division chair or supervisor on other cleaning and safety guidelines.
