Re: Letter of Resignation as an Advisory Board Member


Advisory Board of UNMG,

Administrative Mandate On Required COVID-19 Vaccination

En Español (<administrative-mandate-on-required-covid-spanish-translation.pdf>)

Purpose:

To protect and preserve the health, safety and welfare of the UNM community, the University of New Mexico will require that all faculty, staff and students accessing University facilities and programs be fully vaccinated for COVID-19 as soon as possible, but no later than September 30, 2021. This mandate requires all UNM faculty, staff and students who access campus facilities, housing, programs, services and activities in person to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19, subject to limited exemptions.

Application:

This mandate applies to all UNM personnel and students who access UNM facilities, housing, programs, services and activities located on the Main Campus in Albuquerque, the Academic Health Sciences Campus in Albuquerque, Gallup Campus, Los Alamos Campus, Taos Campus and the Valencia Campus. Campus facilities include, but are not limited to, office buildings, libraries, classrooms, dormitories, research laboratories, dining facilities, student centers, athletics facilities, entertainment venues, gymnasiums and university buses and shuttles. This mandate does not apply to employees of UNM Hospitals, UNM Medical Group and the Sandoval Regional Medical Center; these UNM entities have specific policies pertaining to their employees and facilities.

COVID-safe practices (CSPs) are currently in force at all locations listed above in accordance with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance and the New Mexico Department of Health (DOH) mandates. Individuals who are not vaccinated and do not have an approved reasonable accommodation may not be cleared to access University facilities, housing, programs, services or activities in person. A reasonable accommodation means any reasonable adjustment to a work, academic, or educational environment which provides equal opportunities to individuals with qualifying disabilities or serious medical conditions, or for the religious observances, beliefs, and practices of its students and employees. Individuals who are not vaccinated may be required to participate in or implement additional CSPs to mitigate risk to others whenever they access University facilities, housing, services, programs or activities in person, including but not limited to more frequent and regular asymptomatic surveillance testing and symptomatic testing.

Accommodation:

Disability/Serious Medical Condition/Medical Contraindications: If a covered individual cannot receive the COVID-19 vaccine due to a qualifying disability/serious medical condition or medical contraindications or precautions recognized by the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) or CDC, a request for a reasonable accommodation must be submitted (<https://bringbackthepack.unm.edu/vaccine/vaccine-requirement-exemption-forms.html>) to the Compliance, Ethics, and Equal Opportunity Office for employees including faculty and student employees. A person who is granted a reasonable accommodation may be required to adhere to additional safety measures to ensure the health and safety of the individual and the University community, including but not limited to asymptomatic surveillance testing and symptomatic testing.

Students requiring medical accommodations in their academic environment must submit a request (<https://app.smartsheet.com/b/form/d334941d26274b2191425722e3321e9a>) to the Accessibility Resource Center.

Religious: A reasonable accommodation to the COVID-19 vaccine mandate may be granted based on a person's sincerely held religious belief, practice, or observance. A request for reasonable accommodation must be submitted (<https://bringbackthepack.unm.edu/vaccine/vaccine-requirement-exemption-forms.html>) to the Compliance, Ethics, and Equal Opportunity Office. A person who is granted a reasonable accommodation may be required to adhere to additional safety measures to ensure the health and safety of the individual and the University community, including but not limited to asymptomatic surveillance and symptomatic testing. UNM employees and students who are granted a reasonable accommodation are required to upload documentation of the accommodation at the vaccine verification site (<https://goto.unm.edu/vaccineverification>).

Existing Policies Concerning COVID-safe Practices:

This action supplements, and does not replace, existing policies and guidelines requiring all faculty, staff and students to observe CSPs including appropriate use of either personal protective equipment and/or face coverings, social and physical distancing, frequent handwashing and cleaning, and regular surveillance testing.

Procedures:

All employees and students MUST provide prior to September 30th either (1) documentation of full vaccination using a vaccine authorized by FDA License or under an FDA Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) or (2) provide appropriate documentation seeking an available exemption. All documentation to verify vaccination or exemptions must be uploaded at <https://goto.unm.edu/vaccineverification> (<https://goto.unm.edu/vaccineverification>). International students vaccinated with a vaccine from the World Health Organization Emergency Use List (EUL) may submit documentation of that vaccination (<https://lobocheckin.unm.edu/checkin/svpfa/24>); these students are recommended to be vaccinated again upon arrival in New Mexico using an FDA approved vaccine and subsequently submit documentation of that vaccination.

Temporary EUA Exemption: While available vaccines are under EUA, UNM employees and students may request a temporary exemption (<https://bringbackthepack.unm.edu/vaccine/vaccine-requirement-exemption-forms.html>) to this vaccination mandate. Such employees and students will be subject to regular covid testing, requiring that upon demand they produce documentation of a negative COVID-19 test within 7-days of such request, with the sample having been collected within 7-days of submission of said documentation.

Once any vaccine for COVID-19 is available under regular FDA License, the Temporary EUA Exemption will no longer be available. COVID-19 testing required under this exemption will be at the expense of the employee or student seeking the exemption; the state of New Mexico has contracted with a test provider that currently will provide tests free of charge and this service may be used (<https://learn.vaulthealth.com/nm/>). UNM employees and students requesting the Temporary EUA Exemption are required to do so via the aforementioned vaccine verification website (<https://goto.unm.edu/vaccineverification>).

To protect the health of our community, all employees and students who are not vaccinated may be subject to restrictions on access to UNM facilities, including but not limited to Johnson Center Gym, Student Union Building (SUB), University Libraries, and various events. Other limitations on their access to university programs may be imposed for the safety of the UNM community.

Limited Remote Work Exemption: Employees working entirely remotely can request a Limited Remote Work Exemption (<https://bringbackthepack.unm.edu/vaccine/vaccine-requirement-exemption-forms.html>) on that basis. This request must attest that the employee will not access any university site or facility at any of our campus locations for any purpose, and must be endorsed by the employee's supervisor. An exemption form will be provided to make this request, which must be signed by the employee and supervisor, and then uploaded by the employee at the vaccination verification site (<https://goto.unm.edu/vaccineverification>).

Limited Remote Learning Exemption: Students who are completing a remote online program while residing outside New Mexico during the Fall 2021 or Spring 2022 semesters may request a Limited Remote Learning Exemption to the vaccination requirement. An exemption form will be provided to make this request, which must be signed by student and the dean of the student's academic unit, and then uploaded by the student at the vaccination verification site (<https://goto.unm.edu/vaccineverification>).

Existing university programs to incentivize vaccination will continue until August 31, 2021.




TRANSFORMING UNM-GALLUP'S FRONT DOOR:





UNM-GALLUP GURLEY HALL STUDENT EXPERIENCE PROJECT

INTERIOR RENOVATIONS WILL INCLUDE:

- Interior shell repairs (floors, ceilings, walls, and signage) and HVAC, cooling, heating, electrical, and plumbing system repairs identified in the 2019 facility assessment.
- Adding a learning stair and bridge in the main lobby that provides gathering spaces for students, faculty, and staff while improving connections between student services and administrative offices.
- Adding a stair connection between the basement and the first floor lets natural light into the basement and makes existing space more usable.
- Adding break-out spaces for students along the southeast side of the main lobby and below the new learning stair.
- Replacing railing on the second story and dropped ceiling to allow more natural light to enter the hall.
- Renovating the southwest side of the second floor, adding new windows to the main entry façade to provide a more welcoming student-oriented collaborative space.
- Renovating the cramped food service area with an expanded kitchen layout, equipment upgrades, seating areas, and new skylights.
- Assessment of and potential relocation of programs in Gurley Hall to ensure space is optimized and programs are in proximity to each other, so they benefit students optimally.



GALLUP

B1: Project Rationale and Need. Projects promotion of enrollment growth, retention, and degree production.

Within the competitive higher education environment in which UNM-Gallup operates, we know that capturing the interest of prospective students includes ensuring the experiences they'll have in university facilities, classrooms, and laboratories is not only pristine and welcoming but also conducive to conversation, lecture, and studying.

With the proposed renovation of Gurley Hall, UNM-Gallup will be better positioned to attract students while offering a modern, effective learning environment that today's students expect. Gurley Hall is a collecting place for our community that sets the tone for campus life across the board, whether that's the study, nourish or connect to the so important broadband that our rural students heavily rely on.

We are a commuter campus and having an attractive, contemporary "student union" type building on campus is among our top priorities for growing and sustaining UNM-Gallup.

B2: Project impact on education and workforce needs in local and regional economies.

This year, we are making an investment in the future of our students with the renovation of our Center for Career Technical Education facility through funding so generously provided to us through the 2020 General Obligation Bond.

The co-location of our workforce facilities close to Gurley Hall demands campus synergy that gives students and community members a seamless experience that aligns with upgrades we are in the process of making to ensure the ongoing stewardship of UNM-Gallup. The renovation of Gurley Hall would be a bridge to connect all wrap-around services that support our students. —many of whom are attending UNM-Gallup as first-year college students and attaining certificates and degrees that support regional workforce demands.

B3: How does this project advance the institution's strategic or facility master plan.

The ongoing pandemic has proven to us that facilities need to be used by a modern campus community in a variety of ways, and we are now focused on giving our faculty, staff, and students opportunities to gather in a Gurley Hall space that is open, inviting, and robust.

By expanding Gurley Hall's outdoor lecturing and studying spaces and opening our interior space to allow for vibrant light, spots for students and even classes to gather without being confined, and to allow moving about comfortably align with the facility needs we've identified in our facilities master plan.

As stated in our response to Measure B3, and to reemphasize this point here, we value access to higher education with the support needed to succeed—and this includes facilities that are designed to meet the needs of the modern college student.

B4: Facilities Assessment

Because of its age, Gurley Hall includes mechanical systems and other infrastructure that is so aged that much of the building is inefficient, obsolete, and may soon have components that are outside the legal requirements contained within the American with Disabilities Act (ADA). Renovation in this building's case may cost less in the long run than leaving the building as is.

B5: Projects impact on on-campus and off-campus instruction.

With the possible long-term impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, integrating off-campus and on-campus learning environments is essential to our students' academic success. While the upgrades in technology that are planned in the Gurley Hall renovation will provide access to the off-campus student, the aesthetic upgrades will provide all students with a central hub where they can gather, study, meet with faculty, and socialize in a welcoming place that improves instructional outcomes.

C1: Energy Audit

We let our current response to C1 stand as the documentation is sufficient and provides the required response.

C2: Project impact on energy / utility cost reduction

Among the many planned improvements, the renovation to Gurley Hall will increase natural lighting, reducing the building's energy demands. As with most organizations looking at ways to ensure environmental sustainability and stewardship, UNM-Gallup is committed to energy and utility upgrades that increase efficiency while reducing energy and cost demands on our campus.

In less words, we are giving Gurley Hall an update that demands and costs less and gives more.

C3: EO 2019-003

The University of New Mexico system ensures that our design, planning, and building process will meet optimal reductions of Greenhouse Gas emissions, including the 45 percent called for in Executive Order 2019-003.

D1: Project Estimate

As an expanded response, our project estimate to renovate instead of building new in the instance of Gurley Hall is the essence of good stewardship while leveraging the public funds we receive and maintaining public trust.

D2: Deferred maintenance

We let our current response to D2 stand as the documentation is sufficient and provides the required response.

D3: Asset Stewardship

Our Building Repair and Renewal (BRR) maintenance plan includes pressing needs campus-wide, and we are now prioritizing Gurley Hall as this building contains outdated infrastructure that may someday impact the health and safety of our personnel and students while also remaining compliant. The renovation of Gurley Hall is at the top of our long-term BRR plan, releasing needed funds to address other maintenance needs elsewhere on campus.

D4: Maintenance Cost Reduction

Operating costs incurred from utilities, repairs, inefficient lighting, and maintenance—along with a commensurate reduction in our carbon footprint impact—will be reduced due to the replacement of outdated building materials and mechanical systems.

D5: Health, Safety, and Security

Health, safety, and security, including cybersecurity, are prioritized elements contained within all our strategic and building plans for UNM-Gallup.

Distribution of HEERF III Funding:



RE: House Bill 2 (HB2) Enrollment Language

House Bill 2 (HB2) under the Regular Session of the 55th Legislature requires the Secretary of Higher Education to “...work with institutions, whose enrollment has declined by more than fifty percent within the past five academic years, on a plan to improve enrollment, collaborate or merge with other institutions...[and] reduce expenditures accordingly.” Although your higher education institution has not fallen under this category, it has experienced an enrollment decline of **7 percent** over the past five years.

Current Practices

Recruitment

UNM-Gallup embarks upon a concerted marketing and public relations effort annually to recruit new students and retain current students. These efforts include direct outreach to students (e.g. phone calls, emails, advisement); regular marketing to include direct mail, radio, print, social, and digital advertising; strong partnerships with local school districts (i.e. GMCS, Zuni Public School District) and area charter schools.

UNM-Gallup conducts presentations at high schools including Zoom sessions throughout the pandemic. At the beginning of each spring, we conduct mass admissions at high schools at the senior's discretion and at the high school's request. These students receive provisional admission pending graduation.

We work with our adult education program, our summer bridge programs such as TRIO/Upward Bound to prepare for the social transition to college, and we give campus tours, college visits with local organizations such as the Navajo Nation Program for Self-Reliance and behavioral health organizations.

FAFSA workshops with parents and students are held at UNM-Gallup, the local high schools, or community organizations. We also participate in community events and health fairs.

Our annual commitment to marketing and public relations efforts average \$60k annually with advertising, online content such as video and tours, and other marketing efforts directed at UNM-Gallup students and prospects.

Retention

UNM-Gallup has recently restructured its advisement team to focus on student success. Advisors provide wrap-around services, including sessions on how to be successful in college, how to navigate UNM learn, and we also hold open sessions for new students to bring their questions and concerns.

We have a mandatory new student orientation for new students and transfers, and we hold classroom visits to give an overview of campus and accessibility services. We regularly monitor enrollment lists and reach out to students who have not returned for several semesters. We provide financial support with scholarships and endowments to help with college affordability.

UNM-Gallup has created an early alert system where faculty can enter referrals, and we regularly solicit information at the fourth, 10th, and 12th week interval at each term. We reach out to the student who have been referred to connect them with internal and external resources. Faculty receive a follow-up, so they're informed of action steps. We're also contacted by faculty prior to a student being dropped from a course so an action plan may be enacted.

Students on academic probation meet with an advisor and complete a student success contract where they also complete UNM Learn courses maintained by an advisor so that the student conducts regular learning for the term that they are on probation.

Our faculty regularly plan classroom sessions to give students information about resources such as the Center for Academic Learning (CAL) and the Zollinger Library (e.g., how to access resources and conduct research, etc.).

Recruitment

UNM-Gallup realized a growth curve in academic years 2017, 2018, and 2019. In COVID-19-year 2020, our branch campus saw a precipitous decline suffered by most institutions nationally.

Now that we've returned to more normal campus operations and community restrictions are somewhat lessened, we are bringing back an aggressive community outreach where university personnel attend Chapter House meetings, build relationships with local governmental entities, and foster community goodwill through local sponsorships to correct this one-year drop in enrollment.

- A. As a two-year institution, we focus on our service area which is McKinley County. The work that we've completed to establish relationships with local educational partners will continue to pay dividends for our campus. UNM-Gallup is engaged in conversations including program prioritization to determine community needs and support adult learners and non-traditional students to be productive in their careers. And we seek innovation to deliver new and relevant programs impactful to the workforce.
- B. UNM-Gallup has updated all academic materials to include changes to the common course numbering system. Our support specialists provide transfer guidance to students. UNM-Gallup's TRIO student support services provide transfer campus visits, transfer fairs, and travel with students to UNM's main campus where they have on-campus experiences and meet with advisors.

We also work regularly with our main campus to ensure "branchfers" (students who transfer from our campus to main) have their academic goals fulfilled whether at the two-year degree level or baccalaureate level and beyond.

And we will continue to host transfer fairs and provide resources for students in surrounding areas who want to preview UNM-Gallup.

- C. Due to our proximity to the state of Arizona, we actively maintain relationships and outreach efforts with the Navajo Nation. We also consider that our students are highly sensitive to geography and are location bound. While we benefit from being close to the Navajo Nation in recruiting students close to us, it is often a stretch for these same students to transfer to an institution in New Mexico outside the boundaries of the Navajo Nation.

Retention

As an open-admission community college, we must be well-versed in student preparedness.

- A. For all students, we accept standard entrance exams (SAT, ACT) and conduct placement testing or review alternative methods such as prior academic history and performance. We've also modified our remedial sequence to streamline our program and incorporate the needs of

students deficient in reading and comprehension. For students who place lower than remedial, we actively refer them to our adult education program to complete a skills review.

- B. We understand the challenges of the students we serve based on their level of academic preparedness. We've increased personnel in our Center for Academic Learning (CAL). Faculty also conduct their office hours in CAL so they can be helpful in tutoring students. UNM-Gallup actively solicits and maintains external funding to build and maintain retention and completion through our U.S. Department of Education's TRIO programs.

Our campus is the only UNM branch campus that has a formal Veteran's Resource Center (VRC) and Accessibility Resource Center (ARC). We provide referral services for mental health and other student health needs, including teletherapy. And we have active extracurricular student activities, including student government and chartered student organizations.

- C. Efforts here include optimizing our schedule and identifying the courses students lack to prioritize registration so they can complete their program of study in a timely fashion.
- D. As mentioned above, UNM-Gallup has recently restructured its advisement team to focus on student success. Advisors provide wrap-around services, including sessions on how to be successful in college, how to navigate UNM learn, and we also hold open sessions for new students to bring their questions and concerns. We also utilize a DARS product called Lobo Achieve as our enterprise degree audit system.

Goals

As part of the 2021 Workday Adaptive Planning and Improved Budgeting at UNM, UNM-Gallup's FY23-32 10-year UNM Branch Enrollment Assumptions suggest a consistent one-percent increases in both student credit hours and head count numbers year over year and semester over semester.
